ONLINE SCOUT MANAGER (OSM)

New System Launches!

This month, you should have received an invite to register for our new system 'Online Scout Manager', which gives you, as a parent, autonomy over your child's Scouting experience.

At the moment, you should currently able to use the parent portal to update your child's personal details, explore the badges they have already attained, the badges that they still need and the requirements for completing these at home. You should also be able to upload pictorial and video evidence of your child completing their badges at home, which a leader can then view and respond to – confirming that they have attained their badge.

In the future, OSM will also help us out hugely when planning camps and larger group events – you will be given the option to register interest and complete paperwork online, to save needing to fill out everything using paper and pen!

At next week's AGM, we will be giving a short 2-minute demonstration of the parent portal where you will be able to see exactly how it can be used and the opportunities that are available.



SUBSCRIPTIONS

REMINDER ABOUT PAYMENT BY CONTRIBUTION:

Thank you to everyone who has already paid their voluntary contribution payment – it is hugely appreciated.

At the most recent group parents' meeting, we discussed that, as a group, we still have a number of fixed costs to pay, e.g. rent/capitation etc. so we are unable to afford to have a term without any subscription income. However, we feel it completely unfair and unjustified to ask for a full £35 subscription payment when we are not providing a full face-to-face programme. Therefore, we are asking for a voluntary contribution of £10 per child. We do not want to add any more financial pressures, as we understand many of you will be going through tough times at the minute. Therefore, we would like to stress that the contribution is purely voluntary. If you feel able to give more, or even give a full £35 payment, of course this would be greatly appreciated and received, but is not expected by anyone.

How do I pay my contribution?

Payment can be made in one of three ways:

- By Bank Transfer. Details are: Bank Leeds Building Society; Account Number 14954341; Sort Code 08-61-19. If you are contributing in this way, please add a reference of your child's initial of first name & full surname, e.g. 'J Bloggs'. Alternatively, you can email us with the details of your contribution at westthorpescouts@outlook.com.
- 2. **By Cheque**. Please make your cheque out to 'West Thorpe Scout Group'. This can be posted to the treasurer's address (below). Please ensure that the cheque is in an envelope and please also include the child's name, a contact number and email address, in case there is a problem.
- **3.** By Cash. Please ensure this is held securely in a padded envelope (particularly when posting coins). Again, this can be posted to the treasurer's address (below). Please also include the child's name, a contact number and email address, in case there is a problem.


BADGES AT HOME
