### Returning to Face-to-Face Scouting

The Scouts have recently implemented a 'traffic light system', which is intended to indicate when it is appropriate to move back to face-to-face Scouting. As a Scout group, we are under strict guidance to stick to this model.

This means that face-to-face Scouting can recommence in groups of no more than 15. These activities must take place outdoors and groups must first receive written permission from their District team before recommencing.
